Residents of Warrington are being warned to expect “extremely strong winds” when 2 storms, Eunice & Dudley, hit the UK this week.

A yellow weather warning for strong gusts of wind has been issued by the Met Office.

The warning follows a similar one for Storm Dudley is expected to hit northern most areas of England & Scotland from Wednesday afternoon (16 February)

Storm Eunice is expected to bring very strong winds that could cause “significant disruption.”

There is said to be a small chance of a danger to life from flying debris, falling trees & damage to roofs & power lines.

There is also a possibility for snow & blizzard conditions, although this is more likely further north.

But most places will be hit by heavy rain.

The Met Office forecast for Warrington for the rest of the week is:

Outlook for Wednesday to Friday (16-18 February)

Mild & very windy on Wednesday with widespread gales & occasional rain. Bright spells & showers on Thursday before further rain, very strong winds & possible snow on Friday.
